

MB200 BIRDING IN COSTANERA SUR NATURE RESERVE (BUENOS AIRES)

The Costanera Sur Nature Reserve is situated on the eastern side of Buenos Aires, along the Rio de la Plata (River Plate). Despite being just a few blocks away from the city center, this reserve offers a unique opportunity to encounter wildlife.



As you explore the trails, you'll be surrounded by a diverse range of trees, grasses, and shrubs native to the Pampas and the coast of the River Plate. The picturesque lagoons, set against a backdrop of grasslands, reedmace, and rushes, teem with a wide variety of fauna. Look out for bird species typically found in the Pampas wetlands, including Coscoroba and Black-necked Swans, White-tufted Grebe, three species of coot, various herons, and an assortment of ducks. You can also spot passerines such as the Rufous Hornero. Spectacled Tyrant, Chalk-browed Mockingbird, Great Pampa-finch, Black-and-Rufous Warbling-Finch, Masked Gnatcatcher, and Yellowwinged Blackbird. On a typical visit, you can expect to encounter around seventy bird species.



In addition to birds, you may come across other fascinating wildlife within the reserve, such as Coypu (Nutria), Pampas Cavy, Hillary's Side-necked Turtle, and Black Tegu Lizard.

SCHEDULE:

The reserve is open from Tuesday to Sunday.

April to September: 8:00 to 18:00 October to March: 8:00 to 19:00

IMPORTANT:

The reserve is closed on Mondays and during national holidays: May 1st, December 25th, and January 1st. Please note that the reserve may close unexpectedly during inclement weather conditions. In such cases, your guide will propose an alternative program.
